

Today Dragor Town is a charming village with old half-timbered houses, cosy cafes and restaurants. Only 8 miles from the center of Copenhagen, the visit to Dragor will not only evoke the past, but also give you an interesting and unique experience of the lives in small Danish villages.

In Dragör your guide will share her personal stories about the miraculous rescue of the 7,000 Danish Jews in October 1943.

The tour ends back in Copenhagen.


