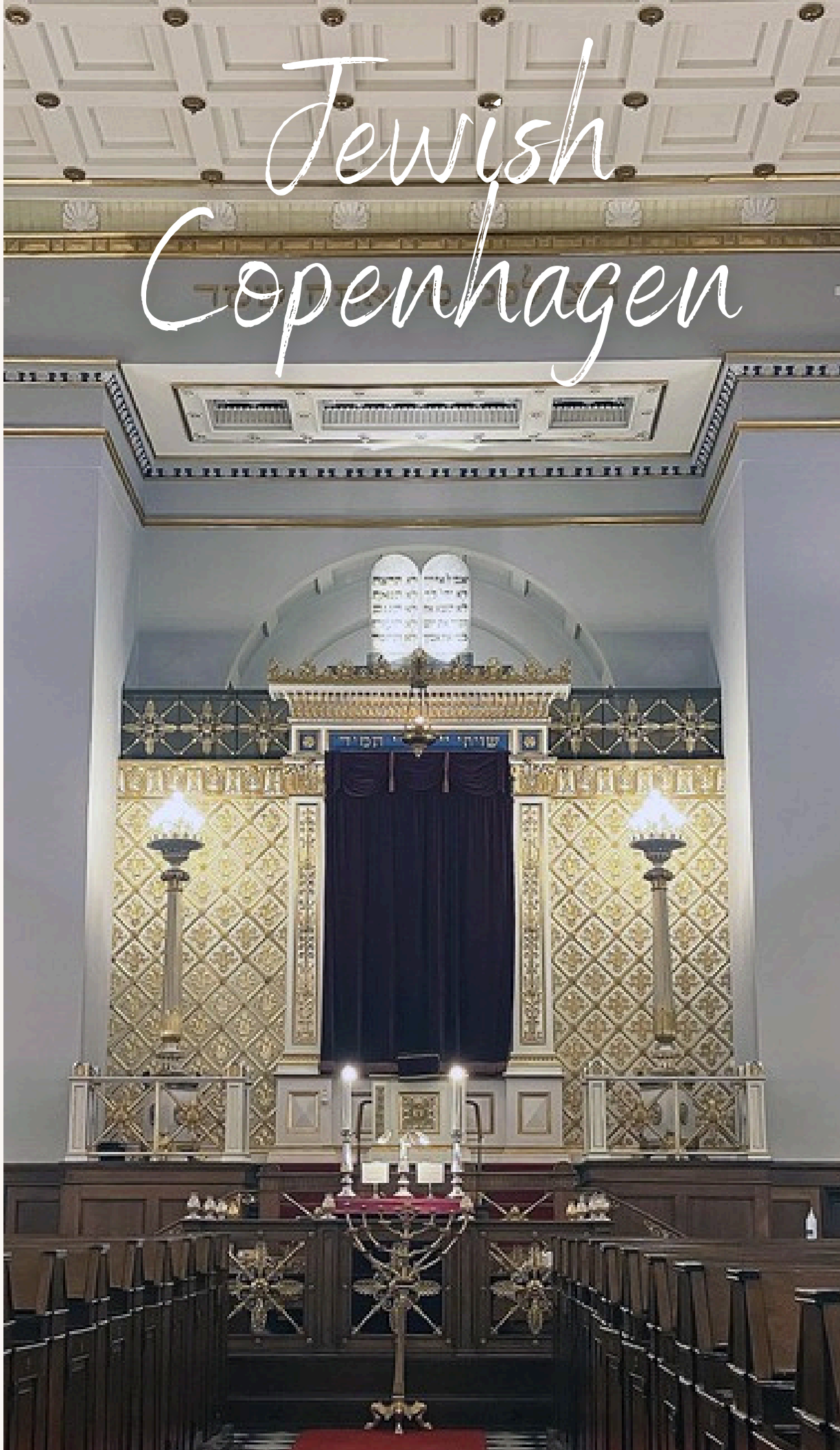

On Rescue Route tour by car, the Jewish guide will tell you the amazing story of Danish Jewry from when the first Jews were invited by the king Christian 4th in 1622, to the present time. A driver with a limousine/van is available all 5 hours allowing us to visit more distant sights and minimal walking.

- Strøget, the main pedestrian street
- The Little Mermaid, national symbol

Raoul Wallenberg Monument

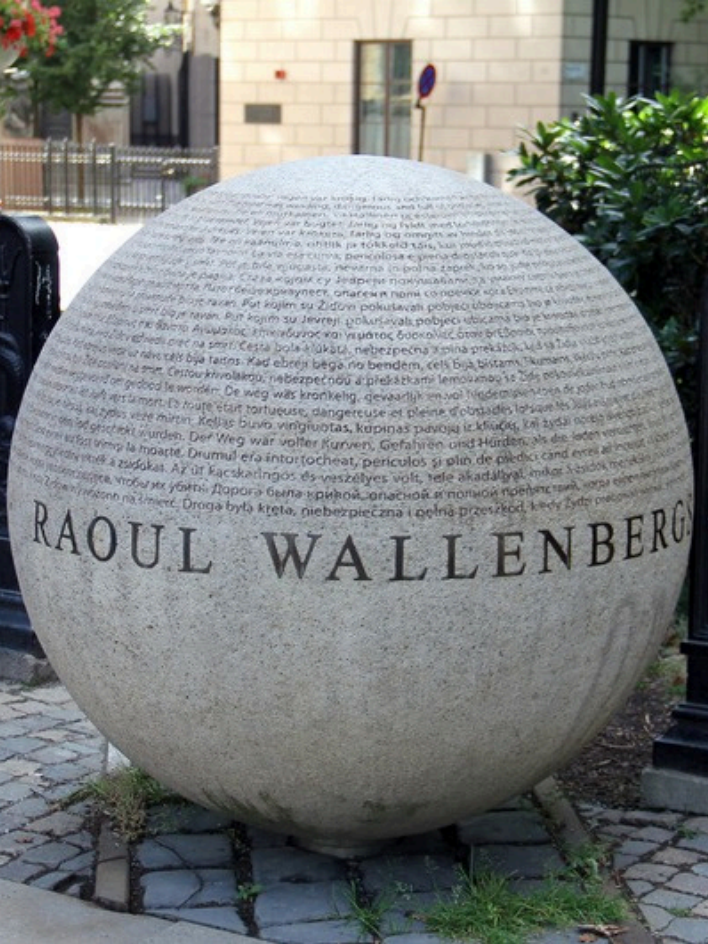
Pay tribute to the bravery of Raoul Wallenberg, who saved thousands of Jews during World War II.

Norwegian Holocaust

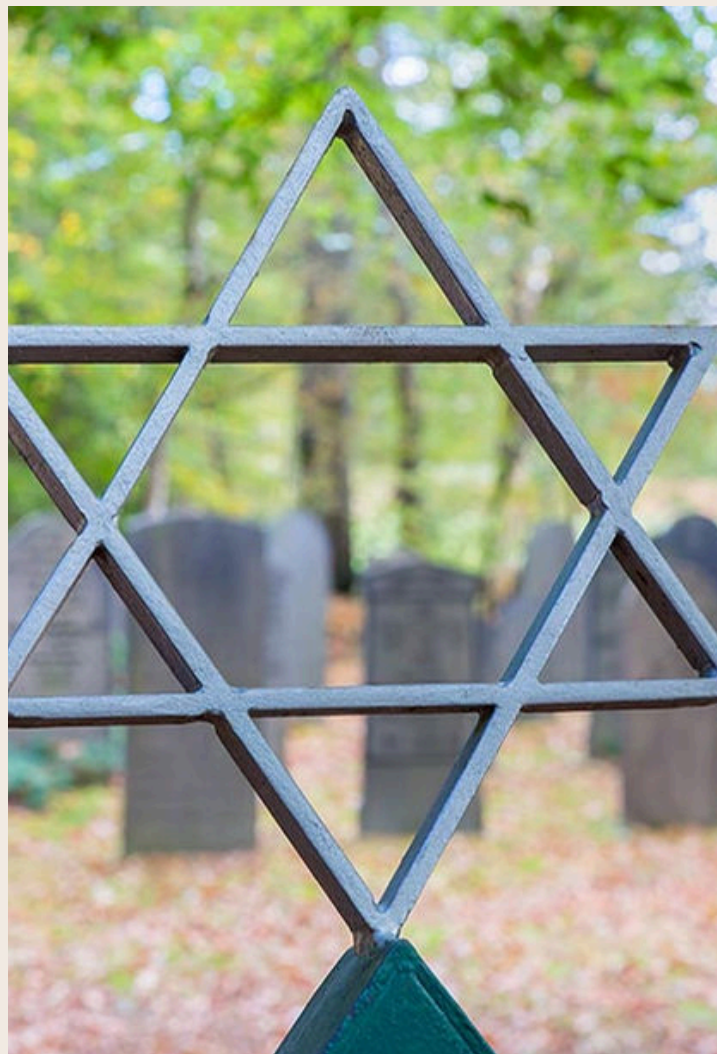
Unlike in Denmark, where most Danish Jews were saved during World War II, one third of Norway's Jewish population (745 people) were captured and deported to Nazi concentration camps, where they were killed.

Despite this tragic past, the Jewish community in Norway has rebuilt itself with strength and dignity.

Today, Jewish Oslo stands as a symbol of survival and cultural resilience, offering visitors a meaningful and thought-provoking journey through one of Scandinavia's lesser-known moving Jewish histories.
